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

Headquartered in Los Angeles, and with 24 clinics throughout the state of California, Aegis Treatment Centers, LLC. delivers an expansive set of services to more than 5,700 patients a day in 15 counties.

Over the last decade, Aegis has pursued a proactive agenda for the advancement of clinical standards and improved patient success rates. Such efforts required the provision of a holistic approach to patient care, with a multidisciplinary and integrated scope of treatment and services.

THE AEGIS AGENDA

Aegis Treatment Centers, LLC., ("Aegis") operates one of the largest networks of Narcotic Treatment Programs (NTPs), also known as Opiate Treatment Programs (OTPs), in the Nation. In 1998, Aegis began implementing a business plan that would upgrade the network into a "State of the Art" continuum of care, a model that has set the standard for OTP operations throughout the country.

The Aegis business plan was instrumental in repositioning the organization into mainstream medical care. Aegis meets and exceeds the most stringent of operating and medical standards in its practice of health care. Aegis employs the most advanced policies, protocols and procedures known to the industry, and is involved with "cutting edge" pharmaceutical and behavioral research & development projects with some of the most prominent research institutions (UCLA, the RAND Corporation), pharmaceutical companies (Bayer, Johnson & Johnson, etc.) and government agencies (NIDA, NIH, NIAAA, CDC).

Aegis provides a comprehensive treatment modality, allowing various staff members to address and sustain the diverse needs of its patients. Along with addiction treatment through "replacement therapy," Aegis has implemented additional protocols and procedures for the treatment of co-occurring mental, emotional and behavioral

conditions, including Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Grief & Loss, Stress & Anxiety, Chronic Anger, Personality Disorders, etc. In addition, Aegis also provides counseling, case management, social work, referrals to community resources, educational programs, eligibility work, vocational rehabilitation and nutritional counseling.

To meet its staffing needs, Aegis has developed training and internship programs in collaboration with over 35 leading academic institutions throughout California, including: UCLA; USC; Cal State LA, Chico, Fresno, and Bakersfield; Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Cal Poly Pomona; UC Davis; UCSB; Pepperdine University; Loma Linda University.

Aegis also collaborates with governmental regulatory agencies. These agencies include the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration / Center of Substance Abuse Treatment (SAMHSA/CSAT), the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), as well as the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS).



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CODE OF ETHICS

Aegis adopts the most stringent clinical, ethical and regulatory compliance standards of any NTP in the treatment of its patients.

These unmatched standards combined with the special emphasis Aegis places on customized treatment focusing on the patients' individual conditions have resulted in unprecedented levels of patient recovery, and an industry surpassing level of clinical success.

FACILITY STAFFING

Aegis employs over 300 staff who deliver services to over 5,000 patients every day.

Heading each clinic is a clinic manager, medical director (licensed MD), and a clinical director (psychologist / social worker). Other staff include nurses, mental health specialists, caseload managers, social workers, dieticians, medical assistants and administrative staff.

Aegis clinics and patients also receive support from governmental agencies, and community resources (e.g., DHS eligibility workers, DSS social workers, EDD voc-rehab counselors, food banks, housing authorities). Most importantly, Aegis patients assist each other and the clinics through participation in Patient Advisory & Advocacy Group (PAAG) local chapters and Keys to Recovery Support Groups (K2R).

TREATMENT PROGRAM TYPES

Aegis clinics are outpatient treatment centers similar to any general medical office with a reception and waiting room, doctor's office, examination rooms, dispensary, and individual and group counseling rooms.

Aegis provides three types of programs: a short-term detox program, lasting 21 days; a long-term detox program, lasting up to 180 days; as well as a maintenance program. The majority of patients are treated in maintenance, which follows the Harm Reduction Discipline, and allows patients to work on their recovery one step at a time.

Harm Reduction is based on extensive clinical trials and studies that show it to be the most successful method for treating individuals recovering from extended periods of drug abuse, while facing multiple problems and conditions in addition to their addictions.

ABOUT METHADONE

Methadone is the primary medication utilized in NTP's, and is a long acting synthetic narcotic drug that has been used in the US since the 1960s. When used in proper doses, methadone is completely safe, and has very minimal side effects. Methadone acts both as an agonist and antagonist, and as such, both blocks the euphoria caused by opiates and depresses cravings for opiates, without causing withdrawal symptoms. Unfortunately, methadone is not a "silver bullet" and its effects are limited solely to drug cravings. Nevertheless, treatment with methadone allows patients to concentrate on the other aspects of their recovery, enabling them to make necessary changes to their lifestyle such as improving their medical conditions, mental health, employment and social life.

THE AEGIS SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Aegis Scope of Practice combines replacement therapy (i.e., therapy with medication), with case management, social work, counseling and specialized services conducted in individual and group settings. When required, patients are referred to outside practitioners and community resources.

Each Aegis patient is assigned to a caseload manager who personally works with the patient throughout the recovery process and coordinates the patient's treatment. Treatment is customized to the individual characteristics and conditions of each patient and treatment plans are developed as a collaborative effort between the patient and their caseload manager. Treatment plans must set short and long-term goals, and place emphasis on clinical risk management, recovery, and relapse prevention. Treatment plans for patients within the maintenance program extend to other areas of the patient's life, and focus on behavioral and lifestyle changes that are essential to successful recovery.

Furthermore, Aegis patients take part in educational programs and support groups headed by and made up of their peers.

AEGIS UNIQUE FEATURES



Providing Evidence Based, Multi-Disciplinary Treatment



Beginning in 2006, Aegis introduced and began implementing the Aegis Model, which incorporates a new multidisciplinary scope of treatment and services. The Aegis Model is an evidence-based system of treatment, and was developed internally within Aegis following a period of extensive research.

- Aegis patients are encouraged to take a bigger role in their recovery (e.g., Keys to Recovery) and the clinic (e.g., PAAG). Aegis' new Code of Conduct & Ethics supports a professional treatment environment, while still emphasizing the importance of patients and their commitment to successful recovery.
- Licensed psychologists, therapists, and social workers are utilized to help patients with their individual co-occurring mental, emotional and behavioral disorders, as well as socio-economic domains of life. These clinicians also provide education to patients prior to treatment, helping them to overcome cultural barriers to treatment (e.g. shame, guilt, denial, ignorance, etc.)
- Aegis continues its extensive involvement in addiction-related research and development with other leading research institutions (e.g., Bayer, Johnson & Johnson, NIDA, UCLA, The RAND Corporation, etc.) in an effort to improve the effectiveness of treatment services. Aegis pursues such research with or without grant funding.
- Aegis has developed internship agreements with many leading academic institutions in California, which allows it access to a pool of talented clinicians that are at an early stage of their careers. Additionally, Aegis provides interns and trainees with an opportunity for professional growth through real-world clinical experience and hands-on treatment of patients with a variety of clinical conditions.
- Aegis has developed and established an Ombudsman's Office, which is a first for the NTP industry. The Ombudsman is primarily engaged with patient complaints and patient concerns, as well as with assisting patients with their justified complaints against governmental agencies, and or officials (e.g., parole, probation, etc.).
- Aegis has contracted a prominent legislative analyst (lobbyist) to assist it in the sponsorship of legislation, which is geared towards the protection of patient rights and the enhancement of clinical and regulatory standards.
- Aegis maintains a General Counsel, whose duties include collaborating with the Ombudsman in assisting patients facing potential cases of discrimination. Addiction is a recognized disability under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Aegis is highly involved in community relations, outreach and political work, in an effort to reduce the stigma and "NIMBY" (not in my back yard) effects associated with methadone and addiction. Aegis consistently sponsors events and conducts "open houses" and presentations for judges, parole and probation officers, as well as other agencies, providers and practitioners.
- Aegis invests a very significant amount of time and resources in the training of its staff members and the development of new, more effective treatment protocols. This is done regardless of the fact that these activities are not reimbursed by the government or other carriers.
- Aegis maintains the highest ethical, professional and regulatory standards. A characteristic that is clear from the recent introduction of Aegis' cutting-edge Corporate Compliance Policy and Code of Conduct & Ethics.
- Aegis Institute (a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation) has developed and supports the Patient Advisory and Advocacy Group (PAAG), as well as Keys to Recovery (K2R) support groups, which are geared towards patient satisfaction. These two amenities are setting a new precedent and standard for the NTP industry.
- Aegis provides its financially indigent patients with financial aid, and has implemented a sliding scale system of rates, allowing for discounts to uninsured and indigent individuals.

RECRUITING OF PsyDs FOR LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT POSITIONS



Aegis recently initiated a post-doctoral program, which recent PsyD graduates have described as unlike any other psychological assistantship in the nation. The program provides PsyDs with the opportunity to develop leadership and management skills within Aegis' multidisciplinary treatment environment, which combines the medical, mental health and social work disciplines to addiction medicine. Such work is done simultaneously with the development of their clinical skills through individual and group supervision. Furthermore, the PsyDs earn other post-doctoral hours toward licensure with the Board of Psychology.

From Aegis' perspective, the addition of these highly trained doctoral level clinicians has had an immediate impact on the quality of patient care, and has greatly increased the talent pool from which Aegis can recruit clinicians and managers.

AEGIS EXPERIENCES A SURGE IN COLLEGE-AGE PATIENT ADMISSIONS



Aegis' patient census has significantly grown in the past several years, with a substantial part of this increase attributed to the influx of less traditional and younger patient demographics (ages 18 to 28). The majority of these new patients seek treatment for addictions to prescription drugs (e.g., Oxycodone). College-aged patients now represent 40.81% of Aegis' census, as compared to only 21.04% in 2006.

Aegis has customized its services to meet the special clinical needs, as well as cultural preferences of this new patient population. It has developed specific treatment protocols and procedures to treat their most common co-occurring conditions, including ADD / ADHD, Stress & Anxiety Management, as well as protocols for Life & Coping Skills, Family Preservation, and Vocational Rehabilitation. Aegis has also expanded its scope of services to include support groups and educational programs for these patients and their parents.

AEGIS ANNOUNCES THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE AEGIS MODEL FOR INTEGRATED TREATMENT OF YOUNG ADULTS

To address the epidemic of young adults abusing prescription pain killers, Aegis announces the Aegis Model for Integrated Treatment (AMIT). AMIT represents a paradigm shift and comprehensive restructuring of the traditional Narcotic Treatment Program (NTP) model. Multi-disciplinary and outcomes-based, AMIT focuses on the synergistic capabilities of medication-assisted treatment, intensive clinical therapy, social work, case management and education in an outpatient setting.

AMIT is an entirely different "product" from tradition NTP treatment in many ways. Some differences include: programs designed to taper patients off of medication; shortened periods of treatment reduced from multiple years to 6 to 18 months; an expanded role for patients in their treatment; and more intensive levels of services. AMIT also involves a larger contingent of licensed personnel in patient treatment, and extends direct services (e.g. counseling, therapy) to family members as well as to patients' significant others.

AEGIS ACHIEVES SIGNIFICANT REDUCTIONS IN PATIENT ATTRITION RATES



Utilizing findings from the Network for the Improvement of Addiction Treatment (NIATx) Study, Aegis put into effect innovative changes to its treatment model that have resulted in unprecedented reduction in attrition rates. Through Aegis' "Five in Five" protocol, attrition rates went from 16% to 4% within the first 3 months of treatment.

The program requires that all new patients participate in a five-day admission process, in an effort to build solid therapeutic alliances early on in treatment. Due to its unparalleled success, Aegis expanded the pilot program to include all of Aegis' facilities throughout the State of California.

NEW PTSD TREATMENT PROTOCOL

Aegis has completed a new policy and protocol for the treatment of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

The internally developed policy includes a new screening tool customized for Narcotic Treatment Program patients, a training curriculum for Aegis clinical personnel, and a program for the education of patients.

Considering the large percentage of its patients who struggle with PTSD, Aegis believes the new treatment protocol will have a major impact on patients throughout the system, particularly war veterans and others who have suffered trauma due to incarceration, abuse, or grief. Unless PTSD is professionally treated, it commonly leads to relapse and ultimately compromises the successful recovery of affected patients.



AEGIS BECOMES BBS CEU PROVIDER

The California Board of Behavioral Sciences Authorizes Aegis Institute as a provider for Continuing Education Units (C.E.U.'s)

CARF SURVEYS

Aegis clinics rated among the highest in the nation.



The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) performed an in-depth review of Aegis' clinics. The extensive, three-day audits were based on the most recent CARF guidelines, and included the review of each clinic's operations, ethical and professional standards, as well as customer service. In accordance with the new guidelines, CARF surveyors placed great emphasis on outcome measuring as it relates to clinical success and customer satisfaction.

As with prior CARF surveys of Aegis' clinics, the clinics were rated among the highest in the nation and granted maximum term (three year) accreditation certificates.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

Aegis finalizes internship programs with UCLA, USC, CSU Stanislaus, & Loma Linda University.



The new agreements are the most recent additions to previously established agreements that Aegis has signed with over thirty other leading academic institutions throughout the state of California.

The internship agreements provide Aegis with the opportunity to recruit the brightest and most qualified students before they are recruited by other centers of excellence. Aegis believes these agreements have been a win-win situation for all parties, and have already greatly affected the working and treatment environment of Aegis clinics. Such programs also serve as a starting point for various other types of collaboration (e.g., research and development, training and resource sharing).

AEGIS UNIVERSITY

Aegis University Website Launched



www.aegisuniversity.com is the first resource of its kind among NTP's in California. The site is a valuable resource for students and practicing clinicians, and utilizes Aegis' substantial electronic library of scientific, clinical and training materials.

Aegis is excited that it can make these resources available to individuals pursuing occupations in the NTP field. The site provides these individuals with access to resources that go well beyond textbooks, and provides them with insight into real-world clinical applications.

Aegis University provides access to a wide range of clinical and government publications, including the renowned SAMHSA Treatment Improvement Protocols (TIP), Technical Assistance Publications (TAP) series, trade journals, PowerPoint presentations, a video library, as well as other related links. The site is funded by Aegis Institute, Inc. (a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation), and by the Department of Agriculture / Rural Utilities Services Grant.

THE AEGIS POST-DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY

Aegis has been approved to become a Post-Doctoral Fellowship site in Clinical Psychology through the California Psychology Internship Council (CAPIC). CAPIC is a consortium of approved clinical psychology doctoral programs that match both pre-doctoral individuals with high quality training sites.



The approval marks a long journey for Aegis, a process that took nearly two years and followed the implementation of significant clinical advancements throughout Aegis' network of programs. Aegis' acceptance is also unprecedented, as it represents the first time a Medication Assisted Treatment Program has been approved as a post-doctoral fellowship site in the State of California.

UNITED HEALTHCARE AND HEALTH NET CONTRACT WITH AEGIS FOR MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT)



Aegis is pleased to announce that it has completed the credentialing process for all Aegis clinics, and executed contracts with United Healthcare / Optum and Health Net for the provision of MAT treatment.

The contracts will take effect on January 1st, 2014, when MAT services will become available to all UHC / Optum and Health Net insured members. This contract will also provide MAT services to the large employer plans that UHC and Health Net manage, which include: Wells Fargo; Target; University of California; Apple; IBM; Cisco; Oracle; etc.

These exciting developments are consistent with Aegis' strategic plan for extending its client base into non-traditional market segments. It is also a result of the Affordable Care Act and the expansion of the essential health benefits package under the Covered California healthcare exchange.

AEGIS PUSHES THE ENVELOPE AGAIN WITH THE LAUNCH OF ONLINE KEYS TO RECOVERY SUPPORT GROUPS



With the launch of the Online Keys to Recovery Support Groups, Aegis brings the support group concept to patients on a 24-hour basis. The online resource, which has already registered hundreds of users, was built in recognition of the shift in media consumption habits of Aegis patients, especially those of young patients. Many patients have commented that 'always available' support groups are an incredible resource, and allow them to provide immediate emotional support and advice to one another when it is most needed.

Aegis has always had a very strong commitment to patient-centered care, and these online support groups will give patients the ability to interact with peers with less stress and anxiety, allowing them to concentrate their energy on the process of recovery. The online support groups were designed and developed by Aegis' Department of IT, and made possible through the generous funding of Aegis Institute, Inc., (a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation).

PEER REVIEW POLICY

Aegis has finalized and is now implementing a new Peer Review Policy.

The policy provides a venue for the critical review of patient records and treatment, and addresses such essential factors as clinical risk management, regulatory and administrative compliance, clinical standards and outcome measuring.

The new policy, which is focused primarily on clinical standards and the training of clinicians, was designed to support Aegis internal audits. The policy follows the development and implementation of a Case Conference Policy, which unlike the Peer Review Policy, was designed to provide real-time responses to the acute conditions of Aegis patients.

NIDA "PARTNERS" STUDY

Aegis Medical Systems has completed the "Partners" Study



The study was funded by NIDA, and authored by Dr. Martin Iguchi from the RAND Corporation of Santa Monica, California. Designed to examine the effects of peer pressure on patient relapse rates, the study measured the effectiveness of relapse prevention through the treatment of patients' "significant others."

The results of the study reaffirmed the assumption that relapse rates are highly affected by peer pressure, and that the inclusion of "significant others" in treatment effectively mitigates peer pressure.

AEGIS INTERACTIVE ADDICTION SEVERITY INDEX (ASI)



The result of over a year of development, the Interactive ASI

represents a significant milestone for Aegis and its patients

Unlike previous assessment & evaluation protocols, the ASI takes a holistic approach to evaluation and treatment, and includes a review of 7 domains of patient life (i.e., medical, psychiatric, substance abuse, social, legal, financial and employment).

The interactive ASI allows patients to complete the assessment on their own. Various studies have indicated that patients are more honest when no other persons are present. Therefore, the integrity of the information collected in this format is higher than conventional methods.

VERSION 4.5 OF PHASE EMR SYSTEM RELEASED



Aegis is pleased to announce the deployment of the latest version of the acclaimed PHASE Electronic Medical Record system. The new version adds new functionality and hundreds of enhancements to the already advanced system. Most significantly, PHASE has added an intelligent decision support algorithm for medication take-homes, as well as a fully integrated QA/QC module, patient assessments, biometric signatures, approval workflows for clinical documents, a smart attachments framework for attaching scanned information, and a more integrated HR management module.

Through the new QA/QC module, Aegis is able to track (in real-time) dozens of quality metrics and activities that are crucial to improving care standards and managing compliance with regulatory and accreditation standards. What used to take weeks to capture and follow up on in the past, now takes minutes, freeing Aegis clinicians to focus on quality improvement activities.

The new version of the PHASE System will have an even more essential role in Aegis' operations and patient care as the healthcare industry transitions to electronic medical records.

PAAG LOCAL CHAPTERS

Patient Advisory & Advocacy Group local chapters developed throughout Aegis' network of clinics



As a result of an opinion letter issued by the PAAG Board, Aegis has taken steps to develop local PAAG chapters throughout its network of clinics. The local PAAG chapters will provide patients with greater transparency relating to the decision-making process of their clinic, and allows them to be more involved in the decisions made by Aegis clinic managers. Local PAAG chapters also serve as focus groups and provide clinics with immediate feedback from the patient population. These members are often invited to support and participate in their clinic's community relations and outreach work.

APPOINTMENT OF REGIONAL CLINICAL DIRECTORS


Aegis appoints regional clinical directors (RCDs) to its clinics

The newly appointed RCDs' primary responsibilities include: participation in clinical decisions, especially as they relate to the 90% of Aegis patients struggling with mental, emotional, and behavioral disorders (co-occurring conditions), the development and oversight of Aegis' internship agreements with academic institutions, the provision of supervision and training to all clinic staff members. Aegis clinical staff members include caseload managers, most of which are MFT and Social Work trainees and interns registered with the Board of Behavioral Sciences, as well as doctoral-level interns registered with the California Board of Psychology.

Additionally, RCDs will be in charge of the development of specialized services and the recruitment of mental health specialists, as well as assisting Aegis clinic managers and medical directors with community relations and networking with local providers and practitioners.
